As well as the traditional flower and vegetable classes there are others for




are others for handicrafts, floral art, baking and three 'children under thirteen only' classes; miniature gar-

News from Nether Poppleton Parish Council

A Parish Council Meeting was held on 15 January, the purpose of which was to discuss the grouping of Nether and Upper Poppleton Councils. It was very well attended and constructive in nature. A vote was held at the end of the meeting and was unanimously in favour of grouping the two Parish Councils. I have written to the Director of Democratic Governance and Monitoring, at City of York Council, requesting that the grouping is given consideration. We will advise on progress in further editions.

River Bank Strengthening



The Environment Agency have now granted a licence for the Parish Council to strengthen the river bank near to Saxe Dane Lodge. This will involve the planting of willow trees on, and adjacent to, the river bank. This work will go ahead when the weather allows. The January Parish Council meeting was very productive, with some £12,750 in grants being discussed and approved.

News from Upper Poppleton Parish Council

From Chairman Neil Lawrence

In the previous Centrepiece Magazine, Sean Barry, the Chairman of Nether Poppleton Parish Council and I co-wrote an article about grouping the two Parish Councils in Poppleton. At the two Parish Meetings in early January, there was a presentation about this proposal, followed by questions and answers and a discussion. The final item at the meeting was the vote. At both meetings there was a unanimous vote in favour of grouping the two Parish Councils. There were no votes against. The presentation and the meeting minutes can be found on the Poppleton website. Consequently, both Sean and I have applied to the City of York Council for a Grouping Order to join the two Parish Councils together. We await their response. Further updates will be included in Centrepiece as they become available.

Pavement Obstructions



On a completely different subject, the Parish Council has received several complaints and comments about obstructions to the

pavements around the village. I have been asked to remind villagers to please park on the road and not on the pavements and to cut hedges back to ensure that the full width of the pavement is available. It is the neighbourly thing to do and would keep pavements clear for people in wheelchairs and for pedestrians. Thank you for cooperating.

Sprucing up the Maypole

The maypole is due to be painted in March, subject



to suitable weather. This is not just for aesthetic reasons, it will also keep the maypole in good condition and prevent deterioration. It will also ensure a nice shiny maypole in time for the Sports Day. This will be an interesting exercise and one worth watching. Keep your eyes open.

Trust to Register for Value Added Tax

As we have reported previously, Trustees have now agreed that we have to register for VAT with effect from our new financial year starting on April 1 2024. We have been working with our advisors and associated clubs to try and minimise the impact on administration and regular hirers of The Centre have already been notified. The benefit of this to the

community centre is that it will achieve a huge ion the impending increase in cost that VAT will saving in VAT on the development project and other costs within the Trust.


Christmas Dinner Winner

News from Julian Crabb

Ordinary Meeting 1 November 2023

'In Sickness and in Health – Health Care in York through the Ages' by Neil Moran.

This was the second attempt following a medical incident 5 October 2022. Dr Moran was on hand to assist. He started the second talk with Hippocrates, Aesculapius and Galen, saying knowledge of the human body and treatment was primitive with dissection forbidden. The Romans were the first to recognise sickness and train healers with remedies based on herbs by trial and error. Roman baths led to a healthier state and cess pits moved away.

The Anglo-Saxon period added little and Monks and Canons still applied most of the treatment. The medieval book of the Barber Surgeons listed 50 diseases known at the time. Henry VIII separated barbers from surgeons and criminals executed could now be dissected surgeons serving a seven year apprenticeship.

The typhus epidemic in York in 1847 led to mass burial opposite the station. York was one of the few places to have early hospitals with 500 beds in 23 hospitals. St Leonards had 206. With industrialisation came chest diseases from pollution and poverty. The Merchant Adventurers' Hall was a refuge for those suffering from syphilis, smallpox and cholera. Gastro-intestinal diseases came from drinking polluted waters until piped clean water was introduced and modern discoveries like penicillin, nitrous oxide and theatre conditions paved the way for modern medicine and surgery.

Ordinary Meeting 6 December 2023


'Newspapers: The Sudan War 1884 and my Ancestor' by Robert Blatchford (member) British forces occupied Egypt in 1882 to protect the Suez Canal and British financial interest. Invasion of Sudan meant access to the Nile and its trade markets, selling textiles, alcohol and guns with new trading routes opening. British, Egyptian and Indian forces fought the rebellious Islamic tribesmen under the Mahdi, Muhammed Ahmed bin Abdulla. The Western Mail paper in England recorded the events in Sudan.

James Blatchford was distantly related to the speaker and born in Cork in 1859. He joined the Navy and was known to be aboard HMS Eurylus. He deserted ship and fell among rough times before accidentally drowning at 52 in Milford Haven Docks.

Ordinary Meeting 3 January 2024

'The Zulu Wars' by Robert Blatchford (member).

The speaker replaced Jane McKeown who was to speak about China but was indisposed. The Anglo-Zulu War was fought in 1879 between the British Empire and the Zulu Kingdom. The British hoped to use Zulus as labour in the South African mines. Initial defeat of the British at Isandlwana met with resistance at Rorke's



Drift and eventual defeat of the Zulus at Ulundi where the Royal villages were sacked and Cetshwavo captured. He was imprisoned at Cape Town but came to England to plead a return

to his kingdom. He was helped by Lady Florence Dixie who invited him to Bosworth Hall. Both Victoria and Gladstone agreed his return but his kingdom was destroyed and respect diminished. He died soon after his return. The speaker and his wife had visited the area noting the graves of both parties.


