### **Out o' Space Project Update**

#### **Fund Hits £200,000**

We have had considerable success in receiving positive pledges of £20,000 each from the Garfield Weston and Bernard Sunley Fundations plus receiving £2,000 from The George Moores Foundation. Both Parish Councils are being very supportive and fundraising events continue to boost the fund such that we have now achieved over £200,000 in cash and pledges to date.

However, getting positive responses from charitable funders is becoming more and more difficult. Trustees have therefore decided to revise their development plans and alter the timing of the original phasing.

#### **Stay Grounded**

We currently have planning consent for the whole project which would create two studios above the Maypole and Dodsworth rooms, enlarge the Poppleton Social and allow for further building to accommodate the long term possibility of Poppleton Library moving from its present site to the Centre.

As the timing of this later phase is a long way off trustees have decided to postpone the upper floor development and concentrate on creating two new studio rooms in the space originally planned for the library at ground floor level. The creation of a Tennis Pavilion and expansion of Poppleton Social will continue as planned. This will provide the same space as the original plan but reduces the cost of the initial project by around £100,000 - so we only have some £160,000 to go!

This will entail a small variation to the original planning consent which is currently being sought.

### News from Upper Poppleton Parish Council

From Chairman Neil Lawrence

### **Doctors' Report**

On 8th April prior to the Upper Poppleton Parish Council meeting, Prof. Mike Holmes and two colleagues form the Haxby Group came to The Poppleton Centre to answer questions and



discuss the services provided by the Group, primarily at Old Forge Surgery. This was a follow-up to the first meeting which was held in January last year. The meeting was again very well attended and shows the interest and concerns of villagers in how (and where) medical

services are provided by the Haxby Group.

Prof. Holmes spent some time explaining improvements which have been made over the past year and contrasted this with the challenges of increased demand concurrent with funding decreases. One important piece of information was the guarantee that Old Forge Surgery will not be closed and in fact its role will be expanded to include teaching facilities.

The reaction from those present was somewhat mixed. As I pointed out at the beginning of the meeting, the NHS is one of the great opinion dividers. This results in some of the attendees having some understanding of the pressures facing the management team. Whilst others, quite understandably, are impatient for improvements and different approaches to solving the problems. You cannot please all of the people all of the time but at least villagers had the opportunity to air their views.

I would like to thank Prof. Holmes and his colleagues for coming to Poppleton and explaining the realities of the health service. Whilst we all may not agree with everything said, we should be thankful that they are prepared to explain the situation to us. We will be organising another session in 2025.

#### **Annual Parish Meeting**

On 8th May prior to the UPPC meeting the annual Parish Meeting was held, which is a legal requirement. The meeting provided the oppor-

tunity to review the main parts of Parish Council business for the preceding year. This included information on where the income comes from and the main areas of expenditure; the numbers of planning applications dealt with; progress on one Parish Council; Council responsibilities such as the greens and the trees, and so on. A key focus area has been the grouping of Nether and Upper Poppleton Parish Councils. Following our respective parish mandates earlier this year, Neil Lawrence and I have engaged with the City of York Council, however their response thus far has been lethargic. We are awaiting confirmation that the CYC are willing to meet, in order that that we then can prepare a timeline and milestone plan.

### **Riverbank Replanting**

We have recently put plans in place to re-plant the trees on the river bank adjacent to Saxe Dane Lodge. This will provide a degree of stability to the bank, as well as visual amenity; we are waiting for the drier weather prior to starting this work. We have also engaged with a pest specialist to ensure that rats who inhabit the cart shed area are controlled.

### **Council Vacancy**

Finally, we do have a vacancy for a Nether Poppleton Parish Councillor. We are a vibrant team who are really trying to make a difference in our lovely village. There could not be a more exciting time to join us, as we look to group the Nether and Upper Poppleton Parish Councils. ### York Foodbank Needs Your Help

In April 2020, writes Linden Richardson, at the beginning of lockdown, residents of Poppleton began supporting York Foodbank. Four years on, and thankfully food donations are still being made and collected every Tuesday morning. At present over 20 tonnes of food and other items have been received. Outside of donations through supermarkets, this is the largest from any single group in the York Area, and I can only add my thanks to those of the York Food-

bank for your generosity in these trying times

Unfortunately, over this period, a reduction in support for not only people on benefits, but also for working people with children has resulted in a 60% increase in demand at the York Foodbank for basic food items. Over the last 2 months demand has been significantly in excess of supply and foodstocks are dwindling at the rate of one tonne a month.

12,000 York Households are now deemed to be food insecure and 2,000 children are living in poverty (classified as not enough to pay for food clothing and shelter).

It was heartening last week to hear

from a person who had undergone difficult times and had had recourse to using the Foodbank. Last week he was in a position to express his thanks for a change in circumstance and make a very large donation as a thank you for the support.

New posters are now up on the village notice boards indicating where you can donate, and even one tin or packet is a great contribution.



### Poppleton History Society

News from Julian Crabb

### **Ordinary Meeting** 6 March 2024

'Pilots 'n' Petticoats - Women Masters of the Sky' presented by David Skillen.

David is well known to the society and comes from Belper in Derbyshire. He presents a wide variety of talks, this being the third he has given to us. His talk was fully illustrated about colourful and determined ladies whose achievements enabled women to write their own place in aviation history. The speaker summarised the lives of over 20 female pilots.

French woman Elisabeth Thible took to the skies in 1794. She was born in Lyon 8 March 1757 and was the first woman to fly a hot air balloon on June 4, 1794. She was followed by legends such as Amelia Earhart, Amy



Johnson and the astronauts Valentina Tereshkova and Eileen Collins. Women have flown every type of aircraft from hot air balloons and biplanes to Concorde and the Space Shuttle.

They have also contributed to the design and development of aircraft and the 'orifice' of Miss Shilling helped win the 'Battle of Britain'. It was a very simple technical device to counter engine cut-outs during negative G manoeuvres in early Spitfire and Hurricane fighter planes. Officially it was called the R.A.E. restrictor but was referred to under various names, such as Miss



Tilly's diaphragm or the Tilly orifice in reference to its inventor Beatrice "Tilly" Shilling.

In more modern times Eileen Collins, born 19 November 1956 in Elmira, New York, became an astronaut in July 1991 and the first woman to pilot the Space Shuttle Discovery STS-63 on February 2, 1995. She made history

again in 1999. On July 23 Lt. Colonel Collins became the first woman to command a Space Shuttle mission. She has written a book "Through the Glass Ceiling to the Stars". Now retired she lives with her husband and two children but



serves on several boards and advisory panels, is a professional speaker and an aerospace consultant.


